Basic Course Communication Information

Program Overview

"The undergraduate Junior Fellows Program provides meaningful research experience, insight into the profession of Political Science, and the opportunity to work closely with a faculty member or an advanced (ABD) graduate student on his or her current research project. The program is designed for advanced students wishing to gain the experience that will prepare them to succeed in their senior thesis work and/or stand out as they apply for research opportunities and advanced degrees. Junior Fellows will have a hands-on experience with the innovative research performed at the Department of Political Science and will gain valuable professional insight by working closely with their supervisor on a weekly-basis, attending a seminar series exploring the diversity of methods and approaches, and participating in a capstone research presentation workshop."²

Requirements with Advisor

1. Meet weekly to discuss research objectives, assign tasks, and maintain progress. If you are registered for 3 credits, you are expected to spend 9 hours per week working on the research project (this does not mean you spend all those hours at school with your supervisor). The initial meeting should serve as an introduction of the research question, the methodological approaches used and the rationale behind them, and the project expectations. It is the expectation of the Junior Fellows program that supervisors will teach and mentor their Junior Fellows in the conduct of research and professional development to prepare them for future research opportunities and advanced degrees.

List of Graded Work

1. Presentation Reports: You will attend 4 (virtual) research presentations.
 - Two presentations are scheduled (and hosted) by me.
 - I will post via Canvas opportunities for the other two presentations as they become available.
 - For each presentation, you will write a presentation summary.
 - Presentation summaries are due within 7 days of attending the event.
2. Progress Reports: There are seven progress reports.
 - Submit a list of progress points.
 - Provide a simple summary of your work in progress
 - I.e. What have you been doing?
 - Does not have to be in complete sentences (but can be)
 - 5 sentences (or so)
 - Include workload
 - hours dedicated to Junior Fellows

Note: this should be a very "relaxed" assignment.
3. Mentor Evaluation: This is to be done by your faculty mentor.

Enrichment: Class and group discussions: There are two class meetings. Attendance is required (but not graded). Group discussions are used to connect you to other Junior Fellows. As a group, we will discuss our research and research projects. I will hold two group discussion meetings. These are not required but encouraged.

UF Policies Shaping This Course

Contact Hours: "Contact Hours" refers to the hours per week in which students are in contact with the instructor, excluding office hours or other voluntary contact. The number of contact hours in this course equals the number of credits the course offers.

Workload: As a Carnegie I, research-intensive university, UF is required by federal law to assign at least 2 hours of work outside of class for every contact hour. Work done in these hours may include reading/viewing assigned material and doing explicitly assigned individual or group work, as well as reviewing notes from class, synthesizing information in advance of exams or papers, and other self-determined study tasks.
